FIRE INCIDENT AT PHUTHADITJHABA INDUSTRIAL PARK, NO

INJURIES REPORTED

The Free State Development Corporation (FDC) confirms that a fire broke out

at the Phuthaditjhaba Industrial Park on Thursday, 18th July 2024. The incident

occurred at approximately 14:00pm and involved a portion of the furniture

factory, which was almost destroyed.

FDC's property management teams, along with the District Manager, responded

swiftly to the scene. According to Tefo Matla, "At around 14:00pm, a dense

column of black smoke was spotted in the industrial area, and at the same

time, FDC received information from security in the park about a fire outbreak

at one of FDC's industrial properties. FDC personnel and the District Manager

rushed to the scene while requesting emergency fire services to attend to the

reported matter.

Following standard protocol, the team alerted both the Maluti-A-Phofung Fire

Department and the South African Police Services (SAPS). Thankfully, no

injuries were reported during the incident.

The cause of the fire and extent of the damage are currently under

investigation. These findings will guide FDC management on the necessary

steps to take moving forward.

The Corporation is committed to working around the clock to ensure that the tenants affected by the fire are relocated to alternative buildings as soon as possible.
