### FDC Strategic Session: Driving Transformation for the Free State

The Free State Development Corporation (FDC) embarked on a pivotal two-day strategic session on 13 and 14 August 2025, marking a decisive step in repositioning itself as the premier developmental agency of the Free State Province.

Day 1 was highlighted by the keynote address from the MEC for DESTEA, Honourable Toto Makume, who stressed the importance of introspection, reform, and the review of the FDC Act of 1995 to ensure it remains relevant in driving the corporation's mandate. This call for reform reflects FDC's commitment to growth, accountability, and alignment with strategic objectives to drive economic growth and development in the province.

Key stakeholders in attendance included the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (DTIC), the Auditor-General of South Africa (AGSA), Chairperson of the Free State Advisory Council, Dr Dan Mosia and the Maluti-a-Phofung Special Economic Zone (MAPSEZ). The discussions centred on strengthening the FDC's role in promoting the Free State as a preferred business and investment destination, developing sustainable SMMEs, and facilitating private sector investment. This formed part of a broader reputational revamp focused on transparency, stakeholder engagement, and excellence in service delivery.

### DAY 2

Day 2 focused on collaborative problem-solving. Board members and management were divided into smaller working groups tasked with identifying solutions to the challenges discussed on Day 1.

The group discussions produced:
Clear identification of key challenges

- Practical recommendations and action steps
- Identification of required resources and potential partners

Each group presented its findings, which were further refined through constructive feedback and discussion. This interactive approach fostered stronger teamwork between the Board and management and resulted in a comprehensive plan to address pressing issues.

## TEXTILE CLUSTER BUSINESS BREAKFAST HELD IN QWAQWA

A recent business breakfast held in Phuthaditjhaba marked a significant milestone in efforts to revitalize the textile industry in the region. This collaborative initiative between DESTEA, the Free State Development Corporation (FDC), and the Maluti-A-Phofung Local Municipality aims to revitalize the textile sector, support township economies and stimulate sustainable job creation

The Phuthaditjhaba Industrial Park serves as a platform to attract investment, foster innovation, and create jobs. The introduction of the Textile Manufacturing Cluster Committee marks a turning point for industrial development in the Free State.



Phuthaditjhaba, once a thriving textile hub, has faced significant challenges, including deindustrialization, youth unemployment, and economic stagnation. The cluster seeks to reverse this trajectory by uniting manufacturers, entrepreneurs, and small businesses.





This initiative aligns with the Free State Growth and Development Strategy (FSGDS), which aims to expand the manufacturing sector's contribution to provincial GDP. The textiles subsector is crucial for absorbing unemployed youth, especially women and young people from previously marginalized communities.

The Textile Cluster Business Breakfast drew key stakeholders, including local textile entrepreneurs, SMMEs, municipal leadership, and FDC representatives. MEC Makume emphasized the importance of unity, resilience, and cooperative development, shifting away from individualistic business practices. This initiative marks a significant step towards revitalizing the textile industry in QwaQwa, creating jobs, and stimulating economic growth.

FDC remains committed to fostering local economic growth and job creation by walking alongside small businesses from vision to success.


















## Women Thriving with Tenacity
